This list is intended as a guide to some of the current popular books available for boys entering the Fours. The aim is to help boys and parents choose reading material that is challenging, rewarding or just plain fun, whilst being age appropriate.

As there are limits on the number of books that can be included in this list, we have often chosen just one title by a particular author. We have also not included many well-loved titles or authors (such as J.K. Rowling, Jeff Kinney, Enid Blyton) because you will already be familiar with them.

Book shops often categorise their books in the age bracket 9-12yrs. Therefore they cover a wide range of reading levels and subject matter. We have tried to include a variety of books for different reading ability. It may be that 'shared reading' is a good way to enjoy some of the more challenging (but exciting!) stories. Being read to is still a very valuable activity for the boys, increasing their vocabulary and their understanding of more complex narrative.

These suggestions are subjective, there will be some books in this list you try but do not enjoy. We hope there will be many you love!


The 13 Storey Treehouse Andy Griffiths

Harry Hill



Hamish and the Worldstoppers Danny Wallace






Flying Fergus

A Cat Called Penguin


Holly Webb


The London Eye Mystery Siobhan Dowd




Sky Song
